The Large Item collection date is Wednesday, January 17, 2018.

In 2018 several new projects will commence using grant funds. The replacement of the Lawton Street Bridge should start late 2018 and finish in 2019. The Third Street Playground renovations will be completed with the installation of a Lions drinking fountain donated by the Lions Organization. And late 2017 the borough received a \$30,000 grant to replace the damaged play structure in the playground. The borough received a \$300,000 grant to upgrade the traffic signalization along Rt. 61 corridor from Ann Street to Terry Rich Boulevard. Pending are grant applications to demolish five to six structures in the borough. And, construction should commence in late spring or early summer for the next phase of development at the Coal Creek Commerce Center.
